## Vaccine Updates



Rockdale, Gwinnett, and Newton Health Departments are all offering additional doses of the Pfizer vaccine to immunocompromised individuals. As of Monday, September 27<sup>th</sup>, these departments will also be providing Pfizer Booster shots to the below groups of individuals: (All individuals must have received both doses of the Pfizer vaccine no less than 6 months prior to the booster vaccine)

- ✓ people 65 years and older and residents in long-term care settings
- ✓ people aged 50-64 years with underlying medical conditions
- ✓ people aged 18-49 years with underlying medical conditions, based on their individual benefits and risks; and
- ✓ people aged 18-64 years who are at increased risk for COVID-19 exposure and transmission because of occupational or institutional setting, based on their individual benefits and risks.

**The Food and Drug Administration has approved the Pfizer vaccine for use to mitigate the spread and effects of COVID-19 in individuals 16 and older. More information can be found [here](#).**

## **COVID-19 Data**

**Rockdale is currently categorized in the HIGH category.**

As of 10/06/2021, the Rockdale County number of 'active' cases (as determined by the DPH daily official updates through GEMA) shows us having a decrease. Over the past 14 days, we are averaging **20.6 new cases per day**. This is a *decrease* from 27.9 new cases per day last week.

**Georgia** has had a total of 1,593,640 <sup>†</sup> (including Antigen tests) total report/tested cases and 23,077 <sup>†</sup> deaths to date (10/06/2021).

Rockdale has had a total of 8,726 <sup>†</sup> (1,077) (this number now contains the Antigen tests) total report/tested cases and 202 deaths to date (10/06/2021). There have been 509 new cases in the past 21 days (9/16/21- 10/06/21). This 21-day number has decreased over the past 7 days. It was 677 last week.

The 14-day positivity rate for Rockdale is 11.6%. This is a *decrease* from last week's 13.3%. This number needs to consistently stay below 10% for us to see long term relief.

The 14-day case rate is 434/100K (confirmed PCR tests).

The 14-day case rate is 495/100K (PCR and Antigen tests). This number has *decreased*.

As of 10/06/2021, Rockdale Medical Center is reporting to be operating at *high* capacity overall, with 50% of ventilators available for use and 6% of critical care beds available. RC EMA is in contact with Piedmont Rockdale and is assisting with resource requests through GEMA, when needed.

Based on current reporting for the COVID-19 vaccine, 61.8% of eligible Rockdale County residents have received at least one dose of the vaccine. 55.0% of eligible Rockdale County residents are fully vaccinated. This number has *slowly increased over the last seven weeks*.

Since its opening on August 25, 2021, the Springfield Baptist Drive Thru Testing Site has tested 3,691 individuals.

Please make your staff, department, family, and friends aware that now is not the time to become complacent in our efforts to combat this virus. As schools, businesses and churches continue efforts to reopen completely, it will be very easy to fall out of our good hygiene habits used to combat COVID. Keep up the efforts and get vaccinated!
