Education & Workforce Development

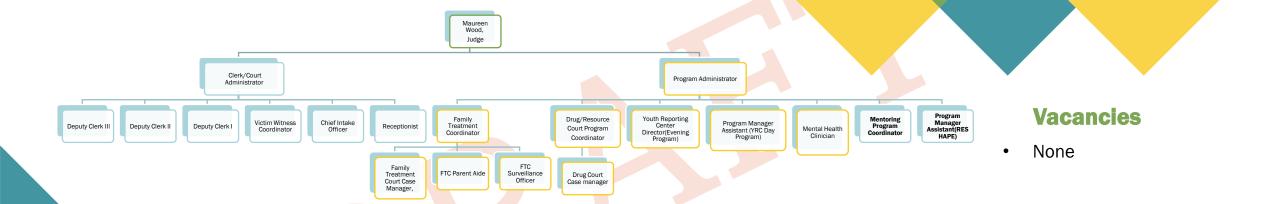
 Impact Day Program, Accountability Courts, Connections with school system, GED programs, technical schools and local businesses support better outcomes for court involved youth.

 Partnerships with local Nonprofits, faithbased and community organizations connect the youth to the community to produce better outcomes for our court-involved youth.

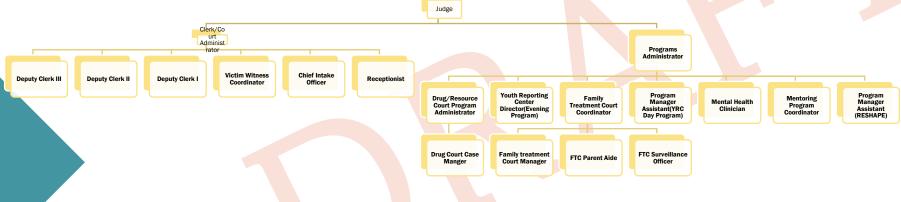
Current Organizational Chart

Operational Request Justification

Requests

Professional Services \$250,000

• Four Contracted Attorneys, Conflict Attorneys & Interpreters: we are one of the lowest paying counties for court appointed attorneys. Increased need for interpreters in court.

Communications \$7,000

• Cellphones for staff, postage, Zoom, & Adobe. Cost for postage and cellphones have increased. Due to the pandemic, we now are using Zoom and Adobe.

Dues & Fees \$3,500

• Dues for Judge and Clerks, witness fees, membership fees. Many of these fees have increased and we have an increases of witness fees.

Education & Training \$8,000

• Training for Judge, clerks & all staff. The Judge & Clerk have mandated training every year. Cost for training registration, hotels, & air fare has increased.

General Supplies \$7,000

Office Supplies for main office & all programs. The prices for many of these items have increased.

Food \$3,800

Mentoring Program Banquet, court trainings, stakeholder meetings, Mentoring Back to School Party, Mentee Turkey Give Away, Food prices have increased.

Books & Periodicals \$2,000

Legal updates for law books, AJC, & Lexis Nexis. Some these process have increased

New Department Total (w/Request)-24

Request Justification

New Position Requests

Juvenile Drug and Resource Court Coordinator 1 FTE - \$83,992

- High percentage of drug use and mental health diagnoses in juvenile justice population
- Programs afford youth the opportunity to receive needed treatment; successful discharge allows no delinquent record & reduced likelihood of receiving new charges
- Cost effective \$67/day for Drug Court vs. \$402/day for juvenile detention
- Supports sustainability for two court programs

Impact Day Program Director/FFT Coordinator 1 FTE - \$79,083

- Impact Day Program provides detention alternative and academic support for youth suspended/expelled from RCPS
- FFT improves family functioning and reduces recidivism 77%
- Cost effective \$75/day for court programs vs. \$402/day for juvenile detention
- Supports sustainability for two court programs
