RFP No. 23-06 STANDBY CONTRACT: DEBRIS REMOVAL FOR EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY

May 19, 2023

RFP #23-06 is hereby amended as follows:

- 1. Below are questions received and corresponding answers:
- 1. **Question:** Please confirm if the scope of work for white good removal includes the removal and disposal of any putrescent food from refrigerators or freezers.

Answer: Citizens in disaster affected areas will be instructed to secure their white goods closed with duct tape or other means. Haulers will not be responsible for opening these white goods and are, in fact, encouraged to keep the white goods closed for health and safety purposes. Haulers will be disposing of any putrescent food by disposing of the white good(s) itself but will not be responsible for opening and cleaning any white goods.

2. Question: EXHIBIT "A" SCOPE OF SERVICES 1. Emergency Road Clearance (pg 21) is normally a scope in which contractors are compensated based on a time and material pricing schedule. There are no time and material items for equipment and personnel on fee schedule provided, nor is it clear what line items on the fee schedule would apply for this scope of work. Can the County please clarify?

Answer: These costs are now captured under line items 24A and 24B, labelled "Emergency Road Clearance: First 70 Hours of Emergency Category B Work." Please see attached updated fee schedule with these lines included.

- 3. Question: EXHIBIT "A" SCOPE OF SERVICES 3. Debris Removal from Public Property and Rights-of-Way (pg 22) states that "the Contractor shall accomplish the pick-up and hauling of all eligible debris to the designated Temporary Debris Staging and Reduction Sites (TDSRS's) from public rights-of-way." which includes "construction and demolition (C & D)". Item 2 on the fee schedule reads "Construction and Demolition debris hauled to and dumped at a County approved disposal site or landfill."
 - A. Can the County clarify if C&D is to be hauled to the TDSRS or the approved disposal site or landfill?

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Answer: The location of debris and C&D disposal will be at the discretion of the County. This decision will be made based on location, scope, and isolation of the disaster area.

B. If C&D is hauled to the TDSRS, can the County clarify what line item on the fee schedule captures the cost to remove processed C&D from the TDSRS to the final approved disposal site or landfill?

Answer: If C&D is hauled to a TDSRS, the same fee applied on lines 2A and 2B will be applied to move debris from the TDSRS to the landfill.

4. Question: There are 2 items on the fee schedule, one is for "Stumps up to 24" in diameter" and the other is for "Stumps over 24" in diameter". Can the County confirm that proposers are to submit a price per stump for those items?

Answer: Yes, proposers should submit separate pricing for removing vegetative stumps both under and over 24" in diameter (as measured 24" above the ground). This differentiation is required to convert into cubic yards per FEMA regulations.

5. **Question:** For items 10a, 10b, and 10c on the pricing schedule, can the County confirm the price requested is per hanger and not per tree?

Answer: Yes, the price requested is per hanger.

6. Question: Regarding the evaluation of the fee schedule, does the County intend on adding up all unit price line items to get a total figure to compare against other proposer's or will there be estimated quantities assigned to calculate a total extended price? If quantities are going to be assigned, what will they be?

Answer: The County will not be assigning unique quantities to each line item during the evaluation process and the County will not be adding up all line items for a total figure. The County will be evaluating each RFP on both a wholistic and line by line ranking. Each RFP will be evaluated for Staffing and Availability, Experience and Performance of the Contractor, Approach, and Cost as outlined on page 5 of the RFP.

- 2. All other conditions remain in full force and effect.
- 3. If a proposal has been submitted and anything in this Addendum causes the contractor to change the item offered or to increase or decrease the proposal price, the new price and/or changes will be inserted below:
