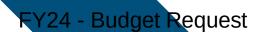

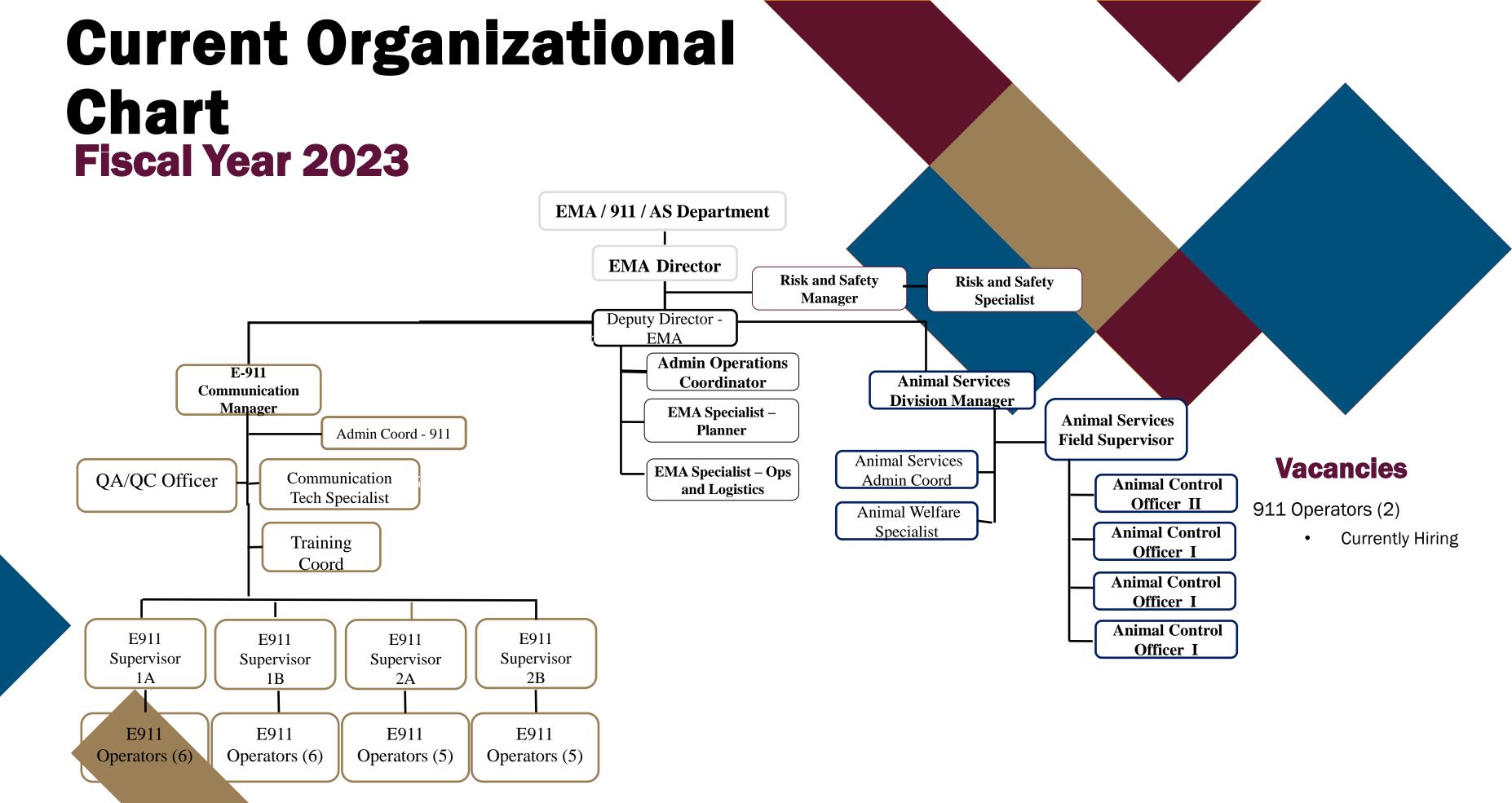

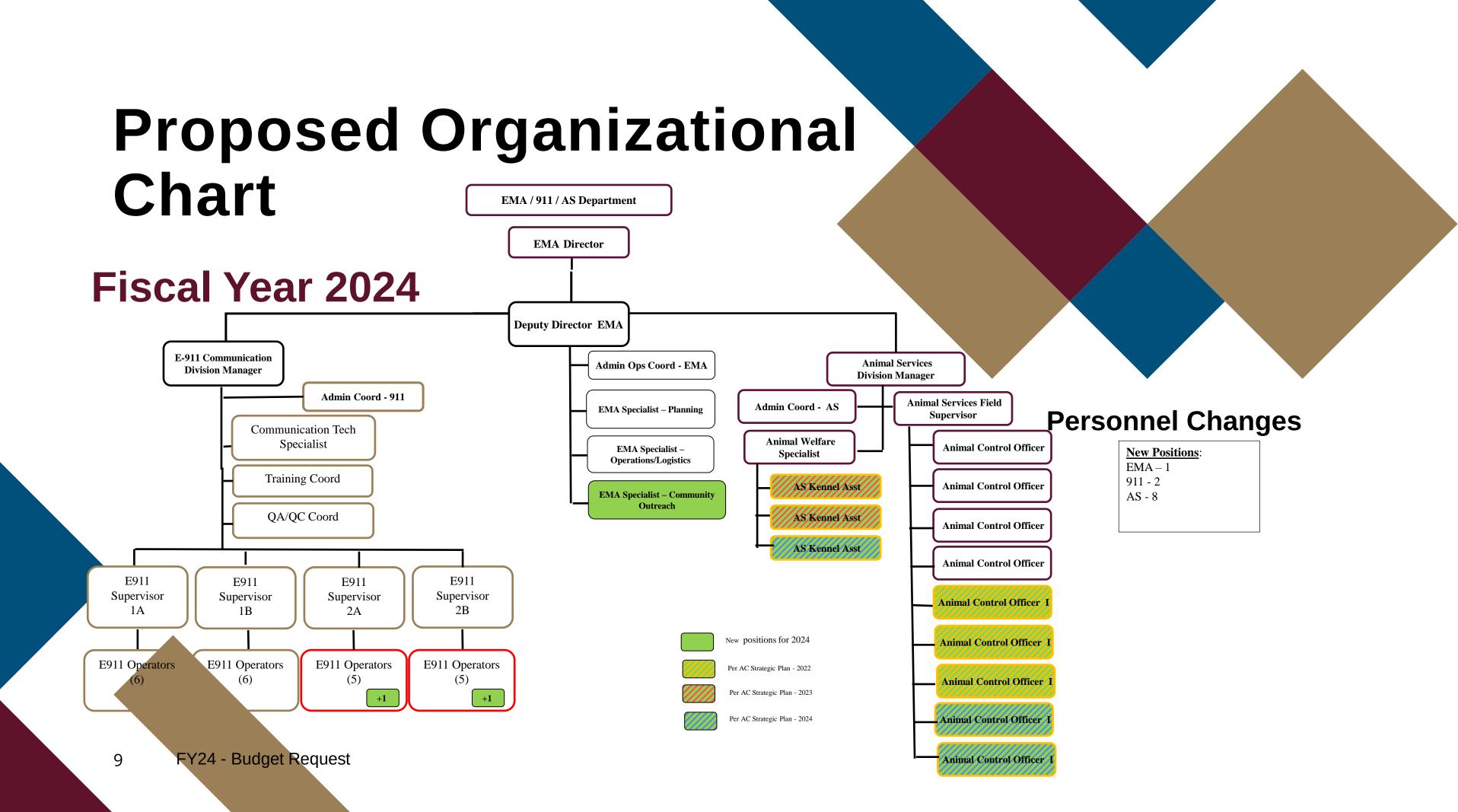

• Needed to provide kennel assistance during operational hours

#### 911 Operators (2)

To bring the Night shifts up to full staffing

#### **Community Outreach Specialist - EMA (1)**

- To provide training and outreach opportunities to citizens
- To carry out educational campaigns such as Weather Siren awareness, youth preparedness trainings, and CERT operations
- Increase citizens understanding of disaster preparedness and early alerting platforms
- Create and foster community relationships to develop planning and response committees

# BUILDING IMPROVEMENTS/RENOVATIONS/EXPANSIONS

2025 Storm Shelters

- \$200,000
- 6-10 storm shelters for Rockdale County Government unprotected work buildings
- 2026 Additional Weather Sirens

- \$150,000
- 5 additional weather sirens at outdoor locations around Rockdale County
- 2027 Remodel Bunkhouse for 911 Staff \$200,000
  - Remodel existing bunkhouse on 911 Center site to make it operational for 24hour operations for all first responders.
