#### **OPPORTUNITIES**

- Have been chosen as a Pilot County to test new Poll Books and Updated Voting Equipment.
- 2. Currently working with the State of Georgia to Improve the in-person voting process by adding more up-todate ballot issuing equipment.

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#### CHALLENGES

- 1. Continuous Legislative changes requiring additional funding after the annual county budgets have been approved.
- 2. Limited availability of State/Federal Grants and Funding for newly mandated requirements.
- 3. Items previously provided by the Secretary of State are now the counties responsibility to fund.

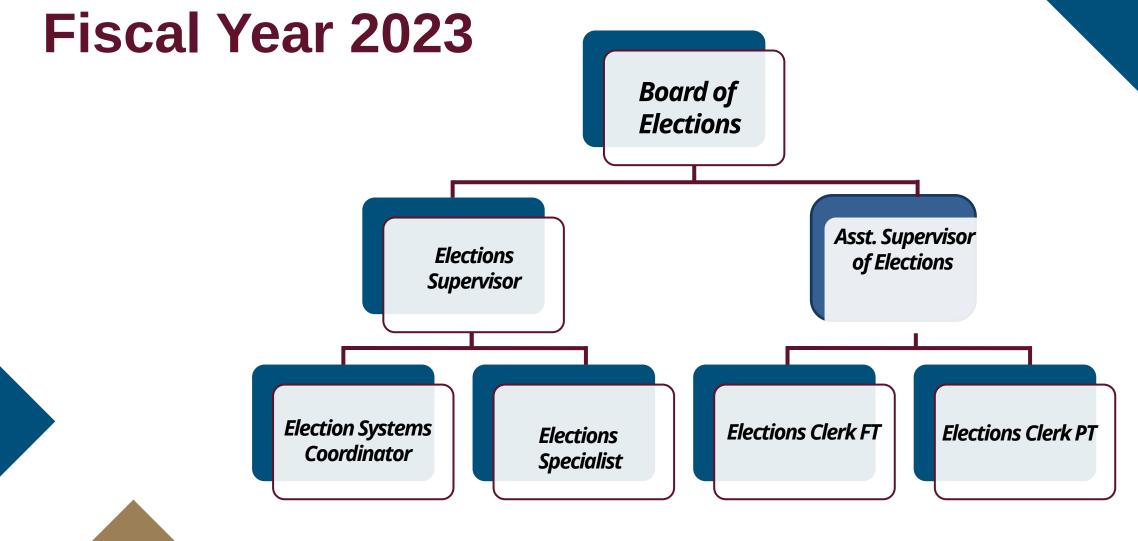

### **Current Organizational Chart**

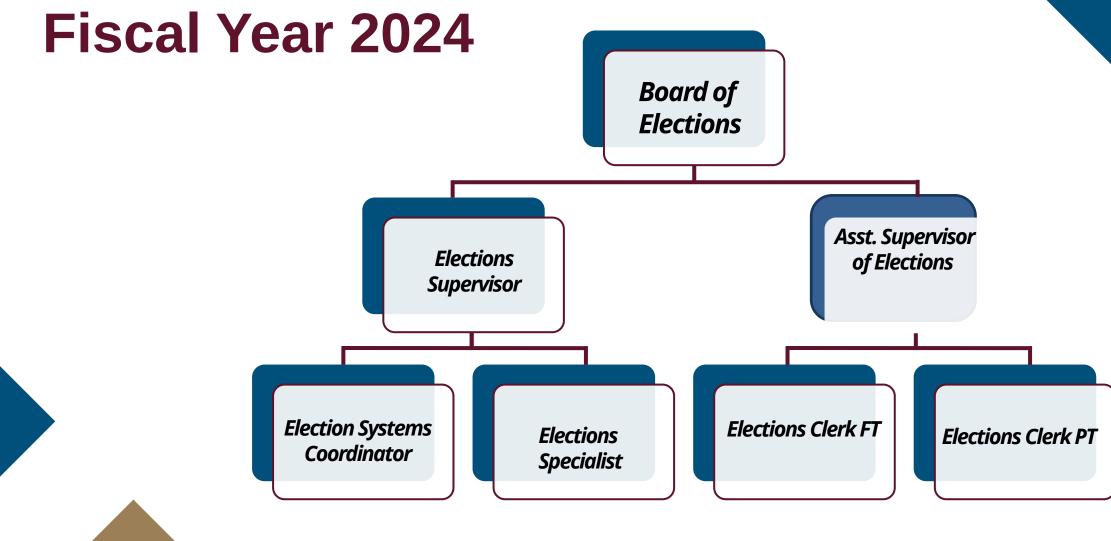

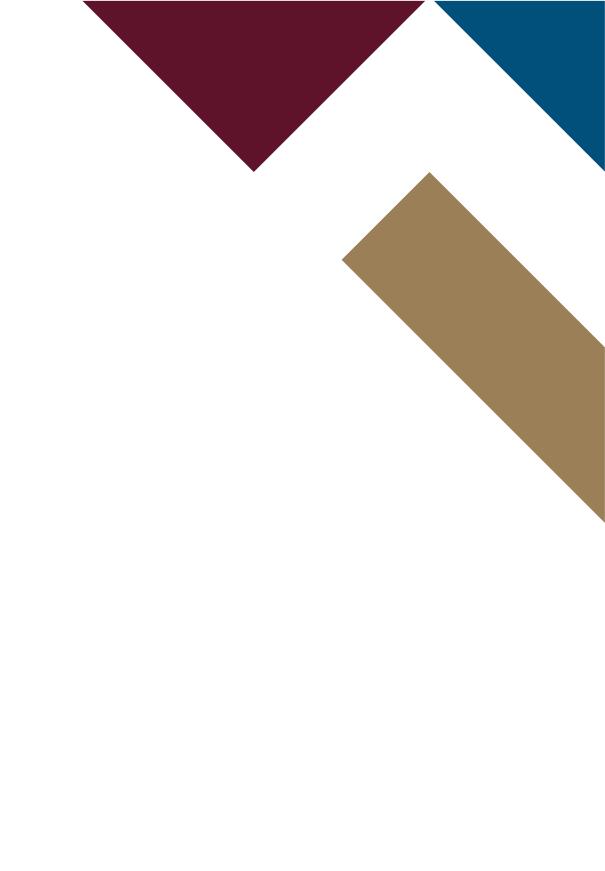
