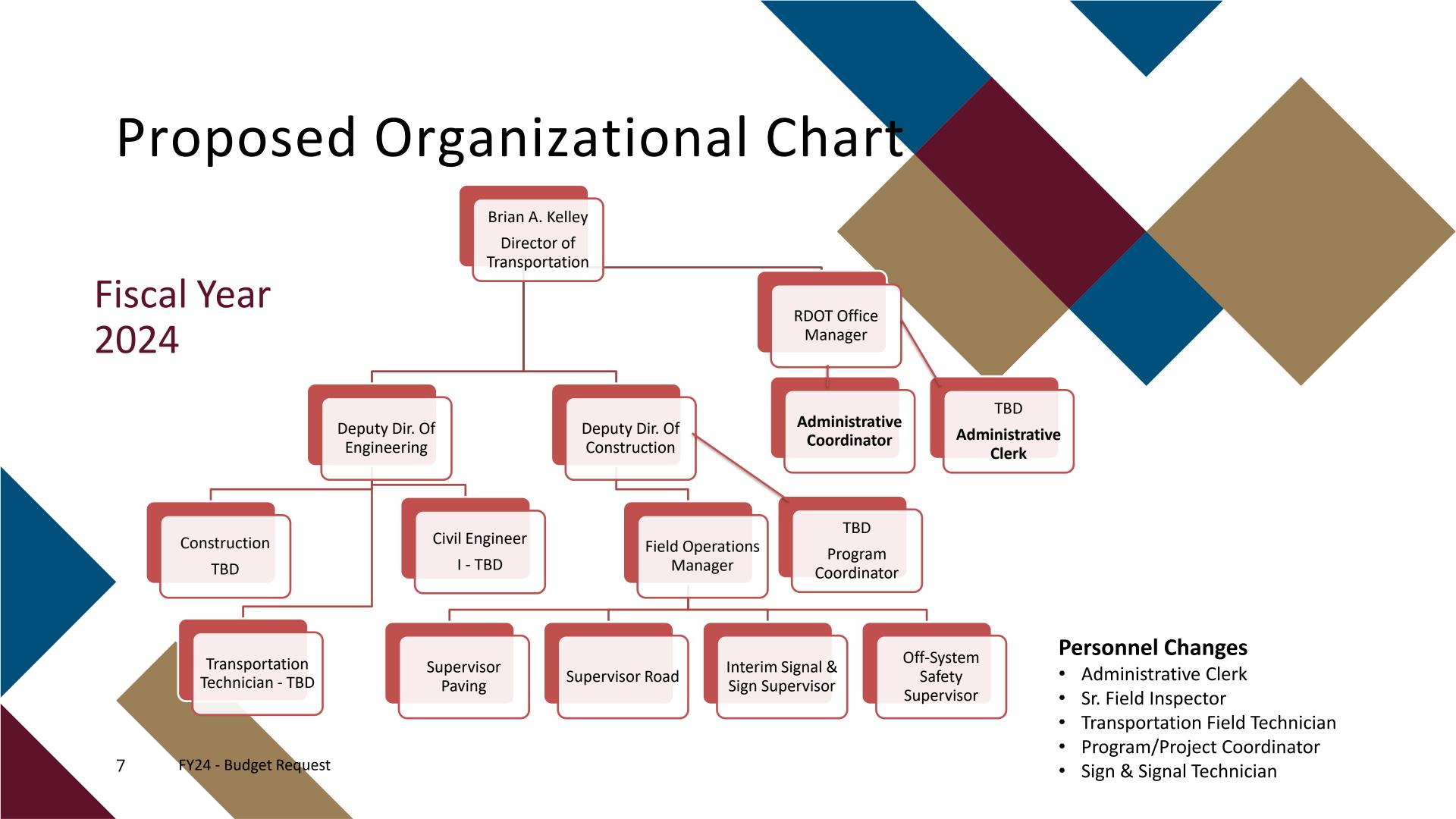

Operational Request Justification

Requests

Traffic Engineering \$900

Traffic signal equipment, bulb, signs, striping of various locations, thermoplastic for schools & sidewalks, rumble strips, guardrails and road safety improvements. Necessary vehicle repairs, Mimaki printer service contract and traffic signal maintenance contract service

Paved Streets \$-85,000

Preventative maintenance on trucks & equipment due to aging. Road maintenance contracts & materials for roads & bridges such as sand, rip rap #57, #89 stone and GAB material, asphalt for pothole repairs, and calcium chloride for use during snow and ice storms/emergency response.

Off-system Safety Maintenance

\$-34,002

RDOT off-system safety group is tasked with maintaining guardrails, sidewalk inventory & repairs, pavement marking updates, I-20 Fence maintenance, etc. Mow and maintain the line of sight, ROW, and Park & Ride. Equipment repairs to vehicles, chippers, tractors & rotary mowers, hydro-seeder, and dump trucks.

Transportation Administration

\$18,500

RDOT admin budget includes professional consulting services followed by repair and maintenance of vehicles. Education and training of RDOT staff is a major part of our foundation as we grow the department as well as furniture updates as our current fixtures' useful life comes to an end.

Operational Request Justification

Requests

Unpaved Streets \$15,000

Additional gravel & GAB, for maintenance of unpaved roads; supplies for dust control applications, seed & straw for Right of Way maintenance and misc.

Highways & Streets \$14,444

Rentals are necessary due to various pieces of equipment needing repairs (excavators, tractors, etc.) The repair cost for this heavy equipment is significant when paired with fuel cost for daily operations. Purchase of uniforms, safety shoes, staff shirts, first aid and misc. supplies. Training for RDOT staff to meet, safety training, pavement operations standards including hot mix asphalt, concrete, soils and GAB, FDR.

Request Justification

New Position Requests

Transportation Field Inspector

FTE - \$101,011

• RDOT seeks to establish this role as part of the internal skilled labor that protects RDOT's Capitol Improvement Project interest. This role would support major projects like Courtesy Parkway, SPLOST 5A, Sigman Road Phase III & IV, etc.

Engineering Technician

FTE - \$154,000

• RDOT seeks to establish this role for pre-construction, preliminary engineering, ROW, & Utilities on all capital and locally let projects. This individual would assist in protecting Rockdale from scope, schedule, and budget changes.

Sign and Signal Technician

FTE - \$60,133

• This role is necessary due to the Rockdale Department of Transportations Succession plan for our department members who will be retiring in the next 24 to 36 months.

Administrative Clerk

FTE - \$62,681

• This role will take on many of the tasks vacated by the Transportation Specialist role and will make way for RDOT inhouse budget monitoring best management practices for Capital Improvement Projects.

Program/Project Coordinator

FTE - \$62,681

 This role provides support for Capital Improvement Projects including assisting with planning & coordination activities, managing external customers on local projects or contracts to keep project on budget.

- Replacement for Ford F150, 150k miles
- 2024 Ford Explorer

Staff use for site visits, training, etc. To reduce mileage expense

Technology Programs & Improvements

- 2024 Street Saver Pavement Tracking Software \$12,500
 - Annual Pavement system to track long-term degradation of county infrastructure including PCI rating.

HEAVY EQUIPMENT

- Ford F-350 Crew Cab 4x4, Drop Side Dump Truck \$100,000
 - Used quick pick up of material, debris, site clean-up
- Freightliner M2 106 Crane Truck -Fassi F145 \$205,000
 - Used to expedite the removal of fallen trees, large debris, and heavy trash items.
