2023 SPLOST Oversight Committee MEETING MINUTES Monday, April 15, 2024 – 6:20 P.M. 911 Facility, 3500 East Fairview Rd. SW Stockbridge, GA

- 1. <u>Call to Order</u>: Chairperson Charles Staples called the meeting to order at 6:20 p.m. and welcomed everyone to the new 911 facility.
- 2. Invocation: Bill Hughey
- 3. <u>Approval of Agenda</u>: A motion was made by Bill William Campbell to approve the agenda, seconded by John Van Der Spek, and was passed unanimously to approve the agenda as presented. **Motion Carried.**
- Approval of Minutes: A motion was made by Michael Sellers to approve the meeting minutes of January 22, 2024, seconded by Mary Greco, and was passed unanimously to approve the minutes as presented. Motion Carried.
- 5. <u>SPLOST Chair Remarks:</u> SPLOST Chairperson Charles Staples gave special thanks to Rockdale County staff including Directors who assisted the community in the aftermath of the tornado. Chairman Oz Nesbit added that Rockdale County had all hands-on deck after the tornado to provide food and water to the community and commending EMA Director Dan Morgan and his team for their assistance in the aftermath. Chairman Oz emphasized the importance of having a SPLOST committee and how significant the decisions the members make for the county's residents.

6. Subcommittees Reports:

- Courthouse: Subcommittee Chair Dextor Bowman announced the Judicial Administrative Complex Groundbreaking Ceremony is Friday, April 19th and members are invited to participate by attending. A motion was made by Courthouse Subcommittee Chair Dexter Bowman to allot \$4.3 for a 3rd level to the proposed Judicial Administrative Complex parking deck from the overage as funds become available and seconded by Nichele Ford, motion did not pass. General Services Director Andrew Hammer provided data for the Judicial and Administrative Complex parking deck:
 - Currently, there are 226 parking spots.
 - The current Judicial Administrative Complex plan will include 320 parking spots.
 - The additional 3rd level to the parking deck will add 140 spaces.
 - The current county staff working in the affected properties is 260.

John Van Der Spek recommends Rockdale County to review and compare Conyers 20-year growth span and decide how many levels would be needed from that growth.

- Finance: Finance Subcommittee Vice-Chair Mary Greco informed that as of February 2024, the sales tax collected is \$21.970 million, which is an average of \$1.997 million per month and collections continue to exceed the monthly goal by an average of \$760,000 per month. Please see the attachment for more information.
- Fire/E911: Fire Subcommittee Chair Bill Hughey provided a brief update on Fire Station 10 and 5, and the Fire Training Facility. Subcommittee Chair Hughey motioned to approve reallocating funds from Fire Station 8 and 4 by reducing \$500,000 budgeted for each fire station and adding the 1 million surpluses to the Fire Training Facility Phase 1 budget. Second by William Campbell. Motion Carried. Please see the attachments provided.
- Parks & Recreation: A motion was made by Parks and Recreation Subcommittee Vice-Chair Joy Douglas to allot \$200K of contingency funds and move three projects to the priority 1 list as funds are available, seconded by Shawn Bilak. Motion Carried. Another motion was made by Subcommittee Vice-Chair Douglas to provide a permanent memorial in honor of Ed Conway in his lifelong contribution to the Lakeview Estates community, seconded by Bill William Campbell. Subcommittee Chair Bill Hughey introduced Ed Conway's son Scott Conway who thanked the committee for the memorial made in honor of his father. Motion Carried.
- Sheriff: Sheriff Subcommittee Chair Michael Sellers reported the subcommittee met on April 9th and received an update on Mental Health Ward from Project Manager Markus Milon.
- Transportation: A motion was made by John van Der Spek to revise 5A Road in removing Tatum Road and replace it with Old Parker Road and add Frontier Road. Not to exceed \$300,000.00 from contingency as funds are available, seconded by Bill Hughey, and was approved unanimously. Motion Carried. A motion was made by John Van Der Spek followed to add Lakeview Estates and Farmer Road connector to 2023 SPLOST Transportation project list not to exceed \$1.8 million, seconded by Shawn Bilak, and was approved unanimously. Motion Carried. Please see the attachments provided.

- 8. SPLOST Members Comments: Sandra Weatherly asked the transportation subcommittee regarding the purchase of the property associated with Springfield Baptist church on Courtesy bypass. Transportation Director Kelly confirmed that the county is still finalizing this purchase with GDOT and that the project will be out for bid approximately in late summer.

- 10. <u>Adjournment:</u> There being no further business or discussion, Chairperson Charles Staples adjourned the meeting at 7:25 pm.
